

## COVID-19 Vaccination Resources

The intent of this document is to provide information and resources to ESC-20 staff on the COVID-19 vaccine.

City officials will keep the sites open for the coming weeks and more residents will be able to register as more vaccines arrive in Bexar County. Currently those who are eligible to receive the COVID-19 vaccines are:

- Phase 1A: healthcare workers and residents at long-term care facilities
- Phase 1B:
  - Residents over 65-years-old and
  - Residents 16 and older with a chronic medical condition. These chronic medical conditions include cancer, chronic kidney disease, COPD (Chronic Obstructive Pulmonary Disease), heart conditions, solid organ transplantation, obesity and severe obesity, pregnancy, sickle cell disease and Type 2 diabetes.

Here's what you need to know to register:

### **Alamodome Vaccine Site**

- In operation beginning Monday, Jan. 11. The site will be open from 8 a.m. to 6 p.m., Mondays through Saturdays.
- To register for the vaccine, visit [covid19.sanantonio.gov/vaccine](https://covid19.sanantonio.gov/vaccine), or call 311 and select option 8. Walk-ins will not be accepted.
- A total of 1,500 people per day can receive the vaccine at the Alamodome site.
- Anyone that lives in Bexar County or in one of the other 26 municipal districts are able to come to the Alamodome to receive their COVID-19 vaccine
- If appointments are full, you can still keep up to date with vaccine appointment openings at [covid19.sanantonio.gov/vaccine](https://covid19.sanantonio.gov/vaccine).

- In operation beginning Monday, Jan. 11. Hours of operation are 8 a.m. to 5 p.m. and subject to change. Walk-ins will not be accepted.
- To register for the vaccine, call (833) 968-1745. The toll-free phone line will be answered between 8 a.m. to 8 p.m., seven days a week.

### **Alicia Treviño López Senior Community Center**

- In operation beginning Monday, Jan. 11. Hours of operation are 8 a.m. to 5 p.m. and subject to change. Walk-ins will not be accepted.
- To register for the vaccine, call (833) 968-1745. The toll-free phone line will be answered between 8 a.m. to 8 p.m., seven days a week.
