Unit 8 - Vergil's Aeneid Book 6 Students will read, comprehend, and analyze lines 295-332, 384-425, 450-476, and 847-899. Students will also practice scansion of dactylic hexameter.

N.B. In all units of study:

*students will apply the skills of comprehension, translation, contextualization, textual analysis, and argumentation as well as explore AP Latin themes.

*students will read Latin aloud using classical pronunciation.

*students will engage in conversations while asking questions, stating opinions and giving commands.

*grade level students do not read all of the texts, nor are they assessed over their ability to translate or write a literary analysis.
