Our World Language Class

- How can I "survive" in a class conducted in the target language? (basic classroom vocabulary; colors; numbers; the calendar; telling time; useful expressions for the classroom)
- What information about myself is essential to share to establish what we might have in common? (ask for/spell your name; introduce yourself; say a few things that identify you e.g. student, musician, athlete, nationality, favorite activity)

Friends and family: introducing others

- Who makes up my circle of friends and family? How can I introduce them and/or share information about them with speakers of the target language? (physical description, basic personality adjectives)
- How does my family life compare with that in the target culture?

WORLD LANGUAGE PROJECTS: learn about France and its culture and tradition focusing on a region of your choice, learn about French famous people researching a famous person of your choice and creating a French format ID card, introduce your family in French creating your own presentation
