An understanding of those patterns along with having a mental map of the United States facilitates the students' study of the history of the United States and the processes that have brought about those patterns, such as the process of migration. Unit 2: Thinking Like a Historian (5 Days) <u>Pensando como un historiador</u> A rigorous study of history requires that students employ strategies for the close reading of historical sources, both primary and secondary. Mastery of the skills used by historians is necessary for students to become resourceful consumers of information readily and abundantly available in twenty-first century society. Unit 3: Coming to America: Exploring and Colonizing America (10 Days) <u>La llegada a América: Explorando y colonizando América</u> This unit bundles student expectations that address the exploration and colonization of North America, specifically the British colonies. Unit 4: Unrest and Rebellion: Fighting for Independence (12 Days) <u>Malestar y rebelión: la lucha por la independencia</u> This unit addresses the American Revolution and its effects. Studying the causes and consequences of the American Revolution facilitates understanding the political system of the United States and the importance of liberty and freedom to Americans. An anxious nation entered into a Cold War, experienced rapid social change during the Civil Rights Movement, and responded to an attack on America on September, 11, 2001. A study of these events is important for students to understand the policies that have shaped American society in the latter half of the twentieth century. Unit 12: The United States Today: Out of Many, One (12 Days) <u>Los Estados Unidos hoy: De entre muchos, uno</u> This unit addresses the characteristics of American society and the cultural patterns that have emerged because of the history of the United States. A study of the values and beliefs reflected in American society is important for understanding the uniqueness of American culture.
